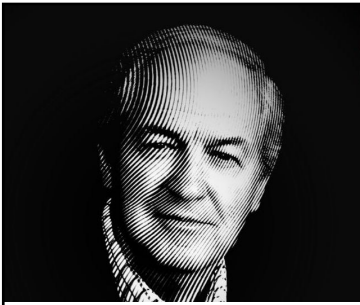

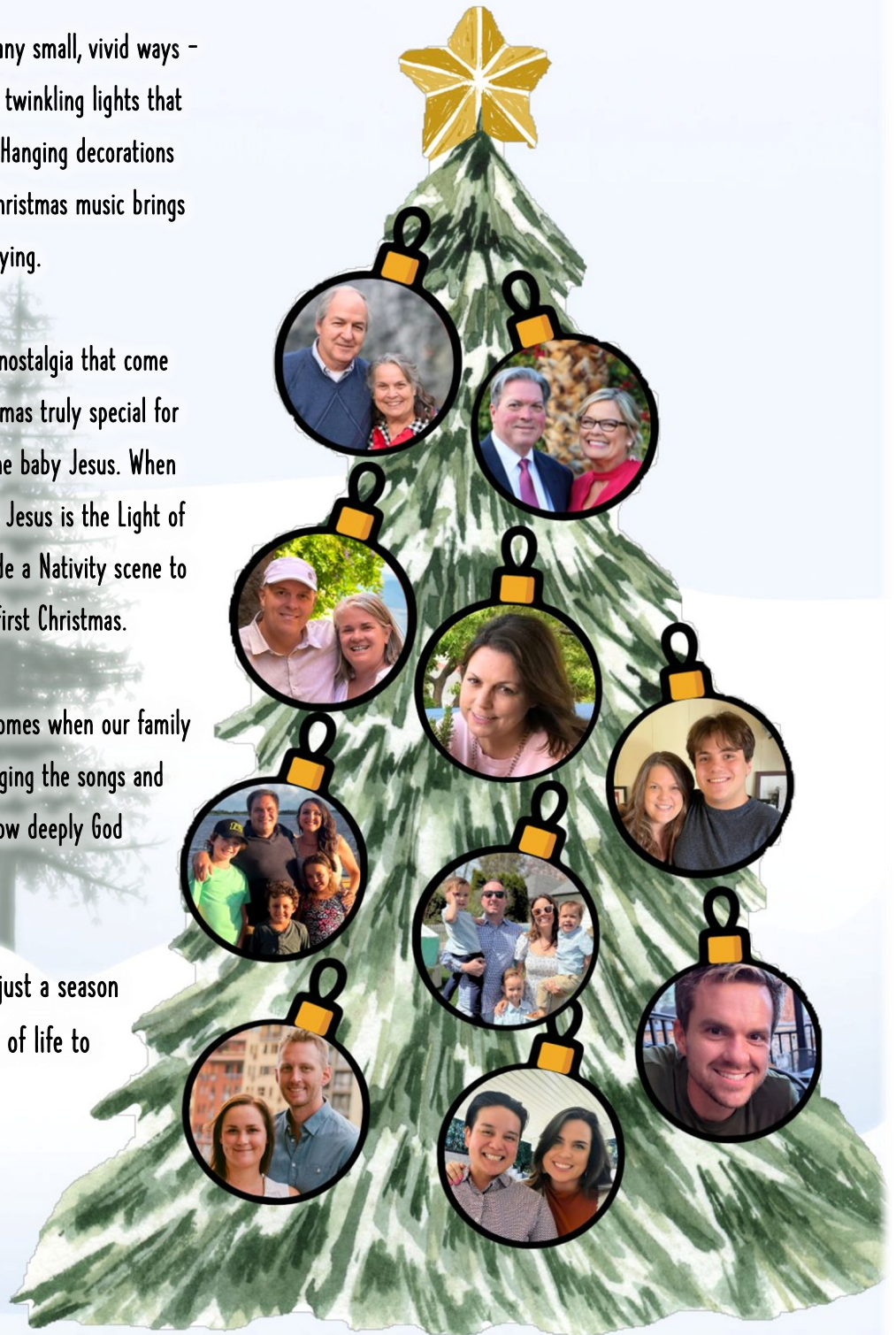

A Very Merry Thank You from Kimball and Pam

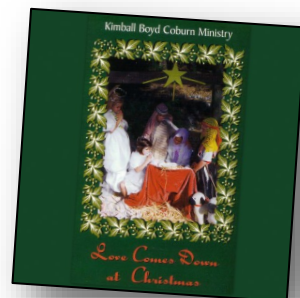
